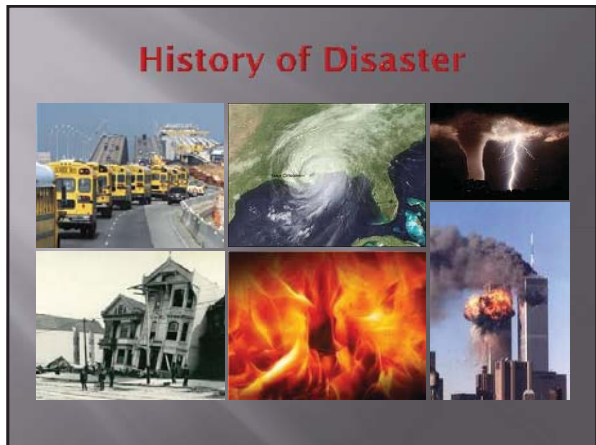

2011 disasters cause \$55 billion in damages in U.S.

This year' natural disasters could cost the United States as much as \$55 billion; prior to Hurricane Irene, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Climatic Data Center estimated that the nine major natural disasters to hit the United States earlier this year caused an estimated \$35 billion in damages
